Proposed plans include:

Low Barrier housing in one or more neighborhoods (low barrier means alcohol and drug use is allowed and prior felony convictions are not a barrier to getting a unit)

Increased density in height, minimal set-backs with a corresponding drop in parking requirements and unit size in currently stable residential areas without any input from neighbors.. Their focus - to maximize the number of people in any given space.

No clear plan on how to cover increased costs of infrastructure demands such as fire, police, schools, roads, and utilities as a result of significant increase in population.

Get informed NOW and work to save our community of Edmonds from the same FAILED ideas of the Seattle City Council.
